# Pastoral Message

# Where Will You Settle?

We often think (in the New Church) of heaven as having three levels, or of heaven being made up of "three heavens" within its overall framework. These three heavens are known as the "natural heaven," the "spiritual heaven," and the "heavenly (or "celestial") heaven." We also know that our final home in heaven will be on one of these levels, depending on the main (or "ruling") love that is established in us by the Lord and by our choices on earth. A person whose main love is obeying what the Lord says-doing what we're told, and doing a good job in all that we do-will be most at home in the natural heaven. A person who grows beyond mere obedience and doing their job well, and whose main love ends up being people (loving their neighbor) will be most at home in the spiritual heaven. And a person who grows beyond loving their neighbor to loving the Lord above everyone and everything else will be most at home in the heavenly heaven.

The question is, "Where will any one of us ultimately settle down and find our place in heaven? Will it be the natural, spiritual, or truly 'heavenly' heaven?" Time will tell.

In all of this, we're taught that the Lord's own hope and goal for us is that we will all end up in the highest or truly heavenly heaven, as reflected in the following passage from the theology of the New Church:

In the Lord's kingdom there are those who are external, those who are more interior, and those who are internal. Good spirits who dwell in the first heaven are external, angelic spirits who dwell in the second heaven are more interior, and angels who dwell in the third heaven are internal. Those who are external are not as close to or near the Lord as those who are more interior, and these in turn are not so close or near as those who are internal. Out of Divine love, or mercy, the Lord wills to have everyone near to Himself, so that they do not stand outside, that is, in the first heaven. His will is that they should dwell in the third heaven. And if possible not merely with Him but abiding in Him. Such is the nature of Divine or the Lord's love. (Secrets of Heaven 1799.1)

Isn't that an interesting teaching? And quite aside from the lovely thought of the Lord wanting all of us to be in the highest heaven—closest to Him—notice what *else* is said—that people who find their eternal home in the natural heaven "stand outside" relative to the Lord and the higher heavens. Isn't that interesting? We might extrapolate from this that people in

the spiritual heaven, although they are closer to the Lord than those in the natural heaven, still (to some degree?) "stand outside," relative to the Lord and the highest, truly heavenly heaven.

Which raises another question: When we think of the word "settle," it can refer to the act of settling down in a dwelling place. But it can also refer to choices we make to be satisfied with something less than what we really want. For example, I may want chocolate ice cream for dessert, but if I don't want to take a trip to the store to get it, I may settle for double chocolate brownies. But if the brownies are downstairs in the basement refrigerator, and I don't want to go fetch them, I may settle for the chocolate chip cookies that I know are in the upstairs freezer.

Well, if there are three heavens, and an existence in the spiritual heaven is "outside" relative to the heavenly heaven; and if and existence in the natural heaven is still further "outside," might we be able to say that a person who chooses either of these heavens for their eternal home is actually settling for something lesssomething less than the truly heavenly heaven?

I remember a moment in a day, a couple years back, when I was struggling with a decision for how to respond to a certain situation. It wasn't an easy decision. Clearly in my mind I wanted to do the right thing in my response. But at the same time there was more that I could do. There was more I could give of myself, more I could do to help and support the people involved...but I was tired that day...maybe my back was sore, or I had

a headache...or maybe life had pulled me in a lot of different directions that particular week. Whatever it was, I didn't feel like extending myself and "going the extra mile" in that moment. I wanted to go a *certain* distance—by doing the right thing—but on some level my thought was, "I just don't want to go the extra distance...I don't want to go further...this is enough."

Was I settling? And if so, where was I settling?

Where will you settle? It's an interesting question.
