# **Pastoral Message**

### **Rain Dance**

Autumn symbolizes a state in a person's spiritual life where there is a decline or a cooling off of the warmth of love and charity - light is still received, but the warmth is missing. What to make of autumn this year, where we are getting plenty of warmth but not enough rain. Doesn't it feel odd to see all the leaves falling while you're still dressing for summer? We can all be sure the rain and cold are coming. Will they come with a bang or with a whimper? It is hard to know. Spiritually, the decline of the warmth of love and charity (signified by autumn) makes for a time of reflection, preparation, and letting go of something that is no longer needed in our spiritual growth - that is, if you are a good person or good church (this decline could also signify the coming death of good in a person or church who has rejected charity). Autumn then, in a good sense, can prepare us for a period where we are feeling the dormancy of love with us and the challenges to come (signified by winter). Taking this further, the "earth" often signifies the church, while the "sun" signifies the Lord. So, what could this autumn signal to us?

Well, first of all, let's remember that I am taking license from our teachings to apply them to our present conditions - something I think we can benefit from, if not only from trying to live more spiritually from what we are given from in the Word. However, this is not a horoscope. I am offering something for us to contemplate with the hopes it will encourage us to help our church and neighbor more.

The Lord's love and His truth are always with us, giving us life and guiding us if we look to Him. There are times when our actions as a person, our actions as a larger group, or the actions of humanity cause discord with the Lord's heavens or even block them from sharing with us the Lord's intended blessings. The Lack of "rain" (signifying truth flowing down from the Lord) falling on the "earth" (signifying the church) during a time when we are getting plenty of "sun" (signifying the Lord), could lead us to reflect on just what that means to us: this autumn is telling us that the Lord's warmth is still with all of us, but His Church ("earth") needs our help. The Lord is saying, "I am here. I love you. The Church needs Me." And I give "Church" here a capital C, to mean all people who will love Him and the neighbor.

Our hearts go out to all those who have been affected by the recent floods, the fires across North America, and the many other natural disasters that have been occurring across our globe. Giving real, physical help,
