Pastoral Message

Love One Another

Love, love, love. "Love the Lord your God." "Love your neighbor." "Love is all you need." "Eat, pray, love."

For decades or even centuries, our culture and our world have marinated in the call to "love one another." As an example, how many sermons have you listened to in the past few years, or messages from great leaders or gurus, in which you've been admonished to "love"? And with that admonishment has come an unspoken promise that if you will "love" others, then all will be well in the world, and all will be well in relationships.

And yet, as we turn the corner into a new year, what is love? What does it mean to love? That's what one of our brightest parishioners right here in Glenview once wanted to know: "I hear all this talk about love," he said, "But I just don't get it. What is love, anyway?" (Said with permission.)

Well isn't it easy? Love is that romantic-type feeling that you feel for someone else. So if you want to do what the preachers and gurus of the world suggest, and "love" one another, just conjure up some positive/ romantic-type feelings toward them (even if you don't feel particularly warm toward them) and "Presto!" "Voila!" now you love them. Right?

But for a long time, noted authors and authoresses have observed that love is not just a noun—a romantic -type feeling. Love is also a verb—a doing word. If we truly love someone, we do something about it—we demonstrate that love to him or her.

And yet love is even more than that; because if you love someone, and you are doing something to demonstrate that love to him or her, the final outcome of your love is...action. In one sense, then, love is the action that encapsulates love, the noun, and demonstrates love, the verb. Love, in the final analysis, is what actually happens—it is what you actively do when demonstrating love to someone else. In short, love is the life that you lead.

Jesus taught this clearly when he said, "They who have My commandments and live them, it is they who love Me" (John 14:21, emphasis added). The theology of the New Church echoes this by saying that "loving means doing, since he or she who loves does, for to love is to will, and to will is to do, when a person is able." (Emanuel Swedenborg, Apocalypse Explained 785.6)

So, like our wise parishioner friend, it's possible that any number of us don't "get it" when it comes to love. We may hear admonishments to "love" others. We may even champion that cause ourselves. But at the same time, we may not have a clear, working idea of what it means to love.

The answer that the Lord gives us is so simple and so clear. Love is what you do; it's how you live your life, "for to love is to will, and to will is to do, when you are able." "They who have My commandments and live them," Jesus said, "it is they who love Me." In the final analysis then, love is action.

Happy new year, everyone. Have a good month – one in which you demonstrate love whenever you are able. (Mark)
