Pastoral Message

We Exist to Serve

One day Jesus sat at a table with His disciples. His disciples were arguing over which one of them should be considered the greatest. Jesus cut through their collective cloud with words that will ring forever: "... Who is greater, he who sits at the table, or he who serves? Is it not he who sits at the table? Yet I am among you as the One who serves." (Luke 22:27)

The words "we exist to serve" are words we've heard many times before—in sermons, discussions, individual conversations, etc.; and they're words we'll no doubt hear again. In home life, at work, and in our marriages... in every interaction we have with children we raise or teach... in every conversation we have with a teen, young adult, or revered oldster... in every encounter we have with another human being... one of the central questions we can ask ourselves is, "How can I be of use to this person, serve this person, or demonstrate love to this person, right here in the present moment?" (See Mark 12:30-31.)

The same is true of any organization, including the Glenview New Church and School—we exist to serve. Just as any one of us grows to discover what we're best equipped to do in life, we have an ongoing opportunity as a church group and school—as a *collective individual*—to gain a clearer and clearer sense of why the Lord has planted us here in the Glenview area.

What <u>is</u> that use? As we look around and experience the goodness of the people in our congregation... the individual and collective talents and abilities that we possess... the unique things we care about and support... why do we think it is that the Lord placed us here—in this corner of the world?

In asking this question, I don't mean, "What do we think our use is *supposed* to be?"—because of some particular teaching in the Word, or because of some particular book of our theology, or because of some favorite doctrine that we hold dear. I'm not searching for a lovely-sounding, "right" answer. As ever, I'm curious to know what *you yourself* believe — in your heart of hearts — about this particular group of people in this particular location. I wonder what it is that we uniquely have to offer, and what you personally think are one or two of the greatest strengths we have for serving people as a congregation in Glenview and the surrounding area.

It seems clear and obvious that the Lord has put each one of us here for many individual uses, and that he's put all of us here together for some good, wholesome, collective ones as well. Let's keep looking for opportu-
