# **Pastoral Message**

# "Freely You Have Received..."

I remember when I was a youth leader at the Carmel Church in Kitchener, Ontario. Christmastime was approaching, and the youth group wanted to do an act of kindness to spread Christmas cheer. So we showed up outdoors at a local supermarket, played Christmas carols on a boom box, and gave away homemade cookies and hot cider. All around the table were signs that said, "Free!"

A man walked up to sample a cookie. One of the youths handed him a cup of cider. "What are you selling?" he asked, a look of mild skepticism painted across his face.

"Nothing," the youth said, "It's for free."

"Ya don't get anything for free these days," he retorted.

"You do today!" the youth replied.

The man walked away in dubious belief.

Imagine coming to a church for the first time. People greet you with smiles, interact with you, and serve you in any way they can. "I know what these people want," you think to yourself. "They're like every other church I've visited. They want my body to help fill their pews and my money to help fill their coffers. They want me to attend their services, buy their beliefs, and sign on the dotted line so that they can be assured of their own long-term survival. ... Ya don't get anything for free these days."

Imagine your surprise as it dawns on you that these things aren't what this particular church is all about. Over time, as the people get to know you, and as you get to know them, you realize that they aren't interested in bartering for your attendance or your money. Instead, they seem genuinely interested in who you are as a person, where you're coming from, how you're doing, and also your long-term welfare.

Imagine a church like that—one that reaches out to others without a single string attached. That would be a little bit of heaven on earth.

"Freely you have received, freely give" (Matt. 10:8).
