### **Pastoral Message**

#### **Choosing Your Spiritual Influencers for** the Upcoming Summer

How many times during a day do you use your internal voice to clearly tell yourself, "I have a choice in this"? How often do you actively contemplate if what you are about to do or say is a good action or an ultimately bad one? How often do you acknowledge that you are never alone in your decision-making?...or do you mostly just do, without much thought?

I would guess that a thought like this, for the majority of people, happens most frequently before adulthood and then slows as a person gets older. As we get older, most of us build lifestyles that avoid confrontation and therefore limit the times our inner voice assists us with our spiritual struggles (because we avoid spiritual conflict, too). On top of that, if we have a spouse or close confidant, they often act as a sort of external/internal voice - instead of contemplating within our minds about spiritual next steps, we can hash it out with our loved one. Better yet, we can argue about how to raise children or how to properly arrange items in the fridge or a drawer like it is a matter of life or death, instead of addressing any internal struggle.

It could be argued that people who have chosen good over evil more than others, may not think "out loud" about what to do as much, because making good choices is second nature to them...or not. People engaging in positive spiritual growth with the Lord do not necessarily experience less temptation or struggle; in fact, their temptations may be deeper and more difficult, because there is good in them worth defending and developing. Over time, as a heavenly self from the Lord replaces their earthly self, temptations diminish and eventually cease (but maybe not until the afterlife), because evil has been removed from the center of their being (Secrets of Heaven 8968). The existence and persistence of temptation is a sign of spiritual progress and the Lord's work within us, not necessarily a sign of spiritual weakness.

It's possible that people who don't go through much internal dialogue around good or evil are simply avoiding temptation and conflict. This avoidance could be from a simple desire for comfort, a complacent will, for appearances, or a lazy spiritual self. People who fall into these categories are still leaving the roots of evil embedded within them-they will need to uproot these evils in the other world, or these roots will hold them grounded to earthly things and prevent their movement toward heaven.

So, if you haven't been going through a lot of spiritual struggles lately, ask yourself, a la Dirty Harry, "Do I feel

lucky? Well, do ya punk?" Have you become complacent? Or are you just a really, really good person? Have you really given it your all, or is there, perhaps, one more in the "upper" chamber?

If you think you have some more room for improvement, then here is some info that may help. Every time we make a split-second decision or fight with ourselves over a big juicy spiritual conundrum, we are accessing spirits or angels with us! The degree to which you spiritually struggle (or not) is directly correlated to the depth in which you associate with given societies of heaven or hell. Maybe, if we pray/ask/ strive for deeper guidance from "core" angels, we can actually associate with more and more heavenly influencers!

Spirits...or angels acting or speaking with me supposed they were doing so from themselves, when yet it came from others more inward, and still more inward than themselves, who were also given the power to slacken and to tighten the restraints governing the will and the mouth... When I had observed this and told them about it, they were indignant for a little while, but still could not but acknowledge it...(Spiritual Experiences 194).

The spirits we are possibly most influenced by are the ones at the periphery of their societies. Good spirits could be "watering down" a message from the most heavenly ones at the "core", to suit our chosen spiritual state. And the lesser evil spirits on the outside edges of their communities, acting as a restraint to the more and more evil spirits at the core of their gang (thanks to the Lord), seduce us into falsities and evils that align with our evil tendencies.

We are not alone in our struggles and joy. There are spirits with us every given second, influencing us. Who have you been hanging out with lately? Do you think

the spirits you're with could get you closer to the Lord? Do they have friends in high places you want to meet? Or are you worried about the company you keep? What is at the core of the societies you visit?

You have choices to make this summer, choices that will not only affect you but those around you. Could you find a better "class" of spirits to associate with? Or are you set? Who will you bring with you on vacation and who will be asked to stay with you after the vacation is over?
